Now as we pass the two-year mark of the pandemic, we want to thank you for your continued support for 1stGenYale. Your engagement from volunteering to participating in one of our 12 live virtual events on career strategies, life skills, and wellness in 2021 enables us to meet the interests of our community.

We especially are grateful to the 23 alumni volunteers who stepped up to help us place 44 Yale College students on financial aid (70% first-gen) with 27 Yale faculty from the Yale Schools of Management, Medicine, and Public Health and 2 nonprofit organizations in the second year of our 1stGenYale Summer Bulldogs program. Our internships were funded by \$153,000 from the Office of Career Strategy's Summer Experience Award (SEA) and the Yale Fellowships and Funding Office.

As we became a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization this past summer, we thank you, our donors, for your financial support which keeps us strong. Since we receive no funding from Yale, your generous gifts of all sizes pay for over \$4,500 in annual expenses for all our electronic operations. All contributions are tax-deductible. This year, we included over \$1,500 for our software program to scale up our Summer Bulldogs work from December through May. We appreciate donations throughout the year - Give to 1stGenYale.

2021 Recap - Successful Second Year

Celebrating our Yale Alumni volunteers who participated in our 2021 1stGenYale Summer Bulldogs program, which ended August 15th!

Twenty-three Yalies ran 112 interviews and helped 65 Yale College students on

financial aid who applied for summer research internships with Yale faculty from YSPH, YSM, YSOM, and two non-profits, YSEA and STEMteachersNYC. Research was funded by the Office of Career Strategy SEA and Office of Fellowship Programs.




Our alumni volunteers were the backbone of this program. We could not have placed 44 students funded by \$153,000 without their help! (Note, we were glad to help the other students who ended up selecting different internships and jobs).

Alumni also participated in our first virtual hands-on workshop created especially for our new interns, *Everything You Need to Know About Your Summer Research*, *But Were Afraid to Ask*. In addition to the new interns, we had broad representation from faculty, former Summer Bulldogs, and alumni who shared their insights and advice on how to be successful in an internship.

First-Year Scholars at Yale



By sharing your own stories, you made our "Alumni Perspectives: Navigating Yale & Beyond" program, now in its 6th year, a heart-felt experience for these incredible students. You brought them into your lives by offering real-life guidance and a love for Yale, both of which will carry them through their next four years and beyond.

Alumni statistics include:

- 70% represented Yale College from the Class of 2020, through each decade to the Classes in the '70's
- 30% were from GSAS (Astrophysics, Chemistry, Economics, & Psychology)
 & Professional Schools (Architecture, Law, Management, Medicine, and Public Health)
- Careers included architects, attorneys, consultants, doctors, educators, financial advisors, HR directors, media programmers, product developers, and public service professionals
- You came from 14 states, WDC, Mexico City, and Puerto Rico


