

Summer Bulldogs

Expanding Internship Opportunities for Yale College Students

Now completing our third year of 1stGenYale Summer Bulldogs, we are thrilled to have placed 99 students in 74 summer internship projects throughout the U.S. and abroad. These placements were funded by over \$323,000 in awards to students through the Summer Experience Award (SEA) from Yale's Office of Career Strategy, fellowships from the Office of Fellowships and Funding, or the sponsoring organization.

New in 2022, we reached out to Yale Alumni Nonprofit Alliance (YANA) in order to increase our nonprofit internships. By connecting with YANA, we expanded service to our communities, increased alumni engagement, and advanced Yale's impact among all sectors of society. Specifically, our nonprofit placements increased from 2 in 2021 to 61, totaling 69 of 99 interns in 2022.

2022 Highlights:

- 126 Yale College student applicants and 46 alumni volunteers
- 96 different internships; 99 student interns
- Interns represented 63% first-gen; 95% on financial aid
- 86 sponsors participated (97% of those who applied received an intern)
- Sponsors breakdown: 27 Yale faculty, 45 alum, 13 other
- Total Yale alumni engaged: 81 (45 sponsors and 46 volunteers)
- 3 virtual workshops with 50+ participants on average each

Participating in the program for the seventh straight year, 1stGenYale members were excited to be back in person at the <u>First-Year Scholars at Yale (FSY) program</u> for the first time since 2019.

For the 92 first-year students and 25 alumni in attendance, the day began with lunch and presentations from our FSY partners: Jeanne Follansbee, Dean of Yale's Summer Session and Associate Dean of Yale College; Pericles Lewis, Dean of Yale College; and Professor Albert Laguna, Associate Professor of American Studies and Ethnicity, Race, and Migration and Faculty Director of FSY.

Professor Laguna moderated a panel with alumni Allie Ossa '11, Yonas Asfaw-Cooper '17, Christian Milian-Santiago '21, and Suzanne Solensky '83, who shared their stories with honesty and passion. A reception followed at which students and alumni could network and learn from each other.

The event was co-led by Yale's Community Initiative team, including Jorge Anaya '19, FGLI Ambassadors, and Dean Burgie Howard. Timeica E. Bethel-Macaire '11, director of the Afro-American Cultural Center, offered us a wonderful indoor space.



Career Networking Mixer

November 10, 2022

During the seventh annual Career Networking Mixer, over 150 students and alums filled the Afro-American Cultural Center for an evening of in-depth conversations and great food that continued well after the event was scheduled to end. Students from Yale College and the

Graduate and Professional Schools met with alums in 14 different career fields.

In this informal setting, students asked questions about how to enter a particular field or how to balance the pursuit of social justice work with the need to earn enough to support other family members. "Excellent" and "terrific" were two words used by alums and students to describe another successful career networking mixer!

Ye Qin Zhu '20 MFA led us around his favorite galleries, finishing with a personal tour of his first New York City solo exhibition at Harkawik Gallery.




Exploring International Opportunities in Public Service






